The Santa Clara Community

Santa Clara High School is a private, Catholic, co-ed, college preparatory high school located in Oxnard, California. Established in 1901, Santa Clara High School exists to provide its students with a Catholic education and is committed to developing faith-filled, morally aware, and academically strong individuals who are of service to society. Santa Clara is owned by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and the Western Catholic Education Association.

Our total enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year is 274 students, with 80 students in the senior class. Our entire student population is 73.7% Hispanic/Latinx, 10.2% Multiracial, 5.8% Asian/Pacific Islander, 4.7% White, 4.4% Filipino, and 1.2% African American/Black. We have six international students from China, Mexico, and Thailand. Most of our students come from Oxnard, a community of over 200,000 residents. Approximately 95% of our students receive financial assistance.

The Santa Clara Curriculum

Santa Clara operates on a semester system and students take six courses each term. All classes are taught on a traditional six-period day with 55-minute classes. All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam.
